

What is Project Protect?

The Office of the Attorney General, county sheriffs, and the Clerks of Courts have partnered to help protect crime victims in Florida by creating Project Protect. This program provides doorbell cameras to victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, stalking, and sexual violence.



Most victims seeking protection injunctions do so through the Clerks of Courts. Trained staff will provide victims with information on how to receive doorbell cameras.

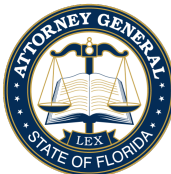
Victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, stalking, and sexual violence can directly benefit from doorbell cameras by enhancing their sense of safety and security at home. The devices can provide 24-hour audio and visual surveillance for a residence – adding a layer of protection for victims of these crimes.

How does the program work?

Project Protect posters will be placed in the Clerks of Courts offices throughout Florida. Clerk staff will provide victims with contact information to directly connect victims with local sheriffs' victim advocates. The trained victim advocates will guide each victim through the process of receiving the doorbell cameras.

Victim advocates can request doorbell cameras and submit for reimbursement of the cost.
